## Relative Clause Worksheet

A relative clause is a clause that describes or modifies a noun and uses a relative pronoun or relative adverb. The relative pronouns are *that, who/whoever, whom/whomever, whose, which*, and the relative adverbs are *when, where, what, and why*.

Example: This is my son that likes to climb.

The relative pronoun in the sentence is *that*. The relative clause modifies, or describes, son.

Below are sentences containing relative clauses. Underline the relative clause and circle the word it is modifying.
