## The Second Conditional

The second conditional refers to hypothetical situations. It refers to something that *could* happen.

Zero Conditional: If you touch a hot stove, you get burned.

First Conditional: If you touch the hot stove, you will get burned.

Second Conditional: If you had touched the hot stove, you would have been burned.
