<p><b>A</b> → <b>snob</b></p> <p><b>C</b> → (snäb) <b>D</b> → <i>noun</i> <b>E</b> → 1. A person who looks down on other people. 2. A person who seeks a higher social position. <b>F</b> →</p> <p><b>snore</b> (snöre) <i>verb</i> 1. 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**A. Guide Word:** a word printed at the top page of a dictionary to show the first or last word on that page.

**B. Entry Word:** a word that is the subject for the entry in the dictionary.

**C. Pronunciation:** how to pronounce the word.

**D. Part of speech:** a category to which the word is assigned (noun, verb, adjective, adverb, etc.).

**E. Definition:** what the word means.

**F. Alternate Definition:** another definition for the word.
