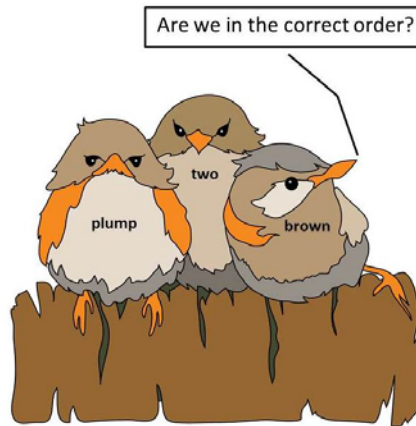


# Ordering Adjectives

We often use more than one adjective to describe a noun, and when we do, the adjectives need to be in the proper order. The table below shows what that proper order is.
