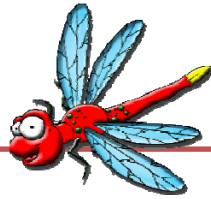


My Talks

There are two ways to express that you are talking about something that is going to happen in the future. Study the guidelines for using **will** and **going to**. Then correct each sentence by rewriting it in the future tense. Choose the correct form. Follow the example.

Use will: To make decisions that are made at the time of speaking
To state a fact about the future
To make a promise
To make a prediction
With words like *I think, I hope, I guess, probably* and *possibly*

Use be going to: If talking about a future event that has been planned before the time of speaking
To make a future prediction based on facts or evidence
