Adverbs - a Verb's Best Friend

VERB + ADVERB=BFF



Adverbs can describe, or modify, verbs. They give more detail about how an action is happening. As a result, they can make your sentences much more colorful and interesting. Often, adverbs end in the letters -ly. Look at the following sentence.

Jane quickly walked to the park.

Notice the adverb *quickly*. It describes the verb walked. It tells *how* Jane walked.
