The Third Conditional

The third conditional refers to a past action that didn't happen and the outcome that would have happened.



Zero Conditional: If you touch a hot stove, you get burned.

First Conditional: If you touch the hot stove, you will get burned.

Second Conditional: If you had touched the hot stove, you would have been burned.

Third Conditional: If you knew the stove was hot, you wouldn't have touched it.
