Correct the Dangling Modifier



A dangling modifier is an introductory word or phrase (a participle, gerund, infinitive, or elliptical clause) that doesn't refer logically to the noun or pronoun that immediately follows it.

For example:

Dangling participle: Eating outside, it began to rain.

Correction: Eating outside, we were caught in the rain.
