## 2 Homophones

The words to, too and two are homophones: they are words that sound the same, but have very different meanings.

**To** is a preposition used to express movement or direction to a point (as to from): *We drove to the town. My dog ran to the ball.*

**Too** means also, or to a greater degree: *I want some too. It is too loud.*

**Two** is a number: *I have two fish.*
