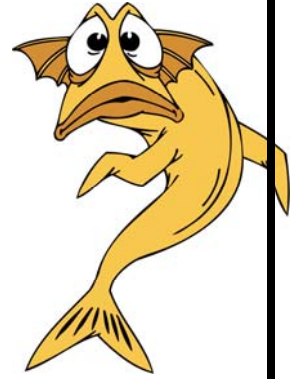

Too means also, or to a greater degree: *I want some too. It is too loud.*

Two is a number: *I have two fish.*
